The rest of the group were able to attend three workshops. The first one was "LWML/Leadership" given by Emily Rogers, President of the Indiana District LWML, Becky Thibodeau, Heart to Heart Indiana District Leader and Donna Madewell-Smith, LWML member of Peace, Indianapolis.

Emily gave a power point presentation on the mission of the LWML. Donations are collected through MITE boxes and brought to the next convention when the money goes to missions. The LWML national goal was \$2M where monies were given out as grants to different groups that were voted on during the convention to receive LWML funds.

Becky presented on the Heart to Heart program that encourages multicultural women in the LWML to celebrate their uniqueness and encourage unity among each other. Reformation." This year, 2017, we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. On Oct 31, 1517,

Martin Luther nailed "95 Theses" (statements) to his church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther complained that the church was selling forgiveness for money! Luther's complaint became like a hot spark on dry grass. Without

his knowledge or permission, someone copied Luther's theses, and published them. Half of Europe quickly joined his protest.



What motivated Martin Luther? He was afraid of dying as a lost sinner. None of his

religious works were good enough. He finally found his answer in the Bible. None of us can save ourselves. Christ alone saves us through His death on the cross, in our place, which we receive only by faith.

During the workshop we watched dramatic portrayals of Martin Luther's life in clips from classic movies about the Reformation.

Rev. Daryl Gehlbach gave a presentation on the history of the

He traced the
history from the
founding of the
Lutheran Deaf

School in Detroit in 1873 to the beginning of ILDA. He showed the steps that led to the first convention in 1971. He explained that although the journey was long and sometimes not easy ILDA was God's work. Just as our past was in God's hands, so is the future. Rev. Friedrich and
